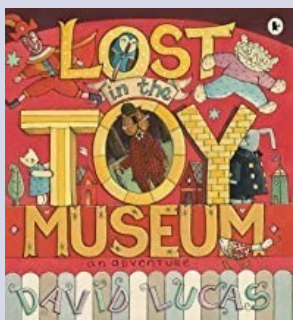


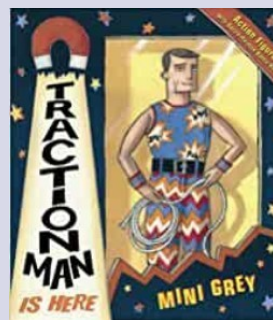

The Lost in the Toy Museum - David Lucas

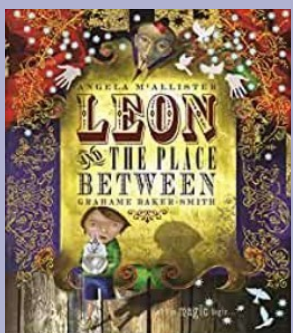

Traction Man - Mini Grey

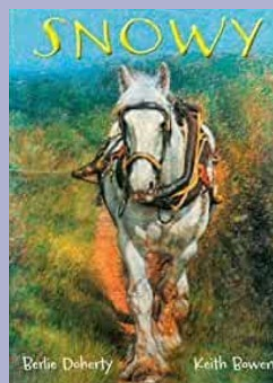

Leon and the Place Between Angela McAllister and Grahame Baker-Smith

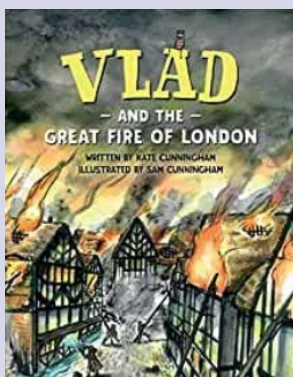

Snowy - Berlie Doherty

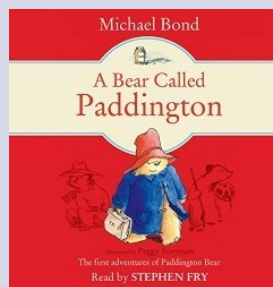

Vlad and the Great Fire of London Kate Cunningham

Vlad and the Great Fire of London is a picture book that supports the Key Stage 1 history curriculum.
