- Awarded the Nobel Peace Prize for civil right in 1965.
- Was assassinated in 1968.

Bus boycott	Black people in America, refused to take the bus to work, school or the shops
Protest	Express an objection to something which is happening
Nobel Peace Prize	An award given to people who have made a significant contribution to world peace.
Civil rights	Equal opportunities for everyone
Segregation	Placing people apart from others
Discrimination	The poor treatment of someone due to their race, age, sex or disability
Assassination	To murder for a political reasons


