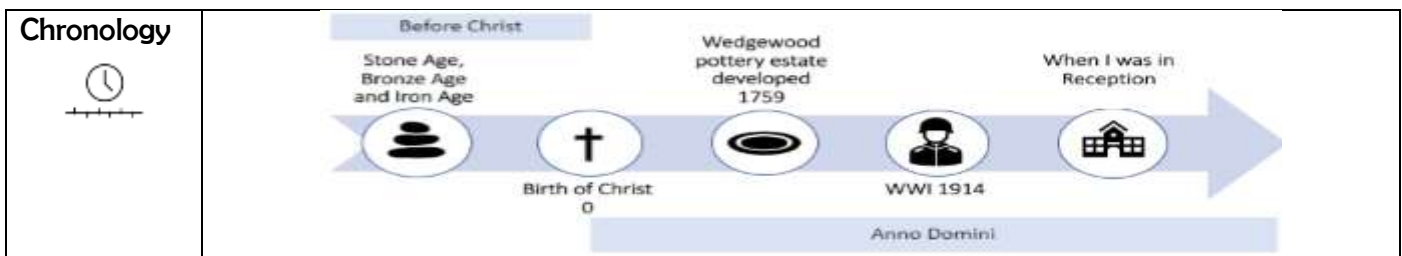

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - about the significance of James Brindley and his impact on the canal system across England and in Stoke-on-Trent. - that people in Stoke-on-Trent were affected by WWI and many men from Staffordshire fought and died in the war. -Begin to understand that life was different for people in the past. -Recognise changes that an event caused. - Christopher Wren helped to redesign and rebuild the city after the fire. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● BC- In the modern calendar, we label all years with B.C. (before Christ) ● A.D. anno domini, or "in the year of our lord". ● Stone Age—around 3 million years ago ● The Stone Age is divided into three parts <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Palaeolithic (Old stone age), Mesolithic (Middle Stone Age) and Neolithic (New stone age). ● Explore how the Stone Age man lived and survived. ● 3000—Stonehenge is built ● 2500 BC –Start of the Bronze Age ● Know about Bronze age tools and settlements. ● 800 BC—Start of the Iron Age ● Know about Iron age tools and settlements. ● 43AD—Romans invaded Britain. ● Identify changes between and within periods Make links between events over time. ● Begin to note the similarities and differences: within current period of history being studied ● Identify evidence in pictures and artefacts. Use evidence from a source to answer a question
