



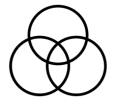

-There were lots of factories and pollution in the cities so rich people visited seaside resorts, like Llandudno, to enjoy some fresh air and different leisure activities like:

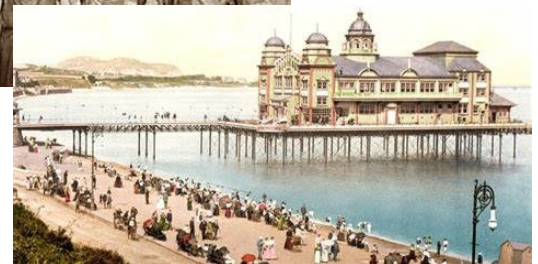
- Punch and Judy
