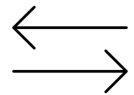

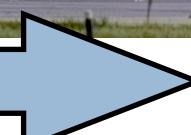

### Vocabulary

<b>Pop Culture</b>	Pop culture refers to cultural products such as music, art, literature, fashion, dance, film, cyber culture, television, and radio that are consumed by the majority people.
<b>Psychedelic</b>	An alternative way of creating art or music within pop culture.
<b>Fashion</b>	a popular or the latest style of clothing, hair, decoration, or behaviour:
<b>Concorde</b>	a supersonic airliner able to cruise at twice the speed of sound.
<b>Blues</b>	folk music created by African Americans in the early 20th century.
<b>Prototype</b>	a first version of a vehicle from which other forms are developed
<b>Culture</b>	the ideas, customs, and social behaviour of a society
