


Fashion	a popular or the latest style of clothing, hair, decoration, or behaviour:
Concorde	a supersonic airliner able to cruise at twice the speed of sound.
Blues	folk music created by African Americans in the early 20th cen- tury.
Prototype	a first version of a vehicle from which other forms are developed
