Piano	An instrument that can play music.	
Octave	Made up of 8 notes. Mozart's piano had less octaves than a normal piano.	



Wolfgang Mozart Classical Period

Wolfgang Mozart was an Austrian composer in the **classical period**. He famously wrote the piano piece 'Rondo alla Turca'.

Rondo alla Turca is also known as the 'Turkish march' inspired by the sounds of the Turkish Janissary bands.

Mozart composed the piece when he was 27 in 1783.

Mozart composed Rondo alla Turca.

He used a **piano** and started playing the piano when he was 3 years old.

A piano is an **instrument** we play music on.

Christmas Carols "Away in a Manger" - America

"Away in a Manger" is a Christmas carol first composed in the late nineteenth century and used widely throughout the English-speaking world. It is known to be an American Christmas Carol.

The most common tune and lyrics were first composed by William J. Kirkpatrick in 1895.



Christmas Carols

A carol is a festive song, generally religious but not necessarily connected with church worship, and sometime accompanied by a dance. A caroller (or caroller) is someone who sings carols and is said to be carolling. These are often sung during Christmas time to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ.
