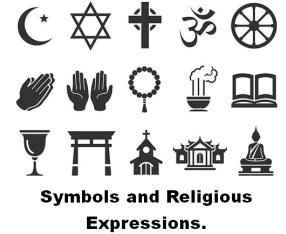

### What is Baptism?

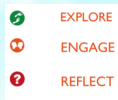


#### Essential Knowledge

Retell nativity story. (Christmas production)

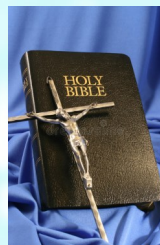
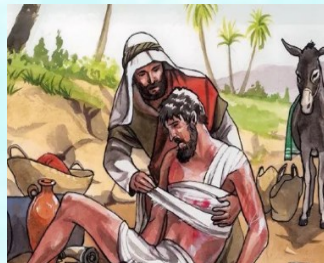
Hindus celebrate Diwali—Festival of light.

#### Key Vocabulary

<b>artefacts</b>	An object that can have religious, cultural or personal significance.
<b>baptism</b>	A ceremony that symbolises a commitment to living a life as a Christian.
<b>crucifix</b>	A cross with an image of Christ on it.
<b>Bible</b>	A collection of sacred texts
<b>font</b>	A basin to hold holy water for baptism.
<b>ceremony</b>	A formal act or series of acts done in a particular way to honour a special occasion.
