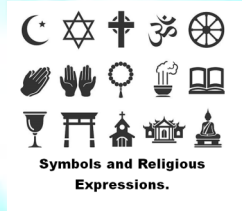

What does the 'creation story' explain?

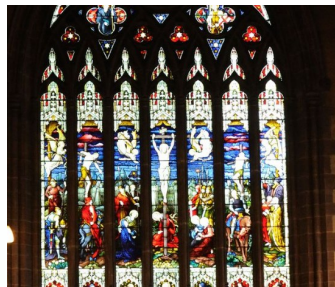


Essential knowledge

stained glass windows	A window made of coloured glass, often showing religious pictures and usually seen in churches
