Key Vocabulary

Ramadan	Holy month of Islamic calendar, where Muslims, fast, pray and reflect.
Eid ul Fitr	Muslims celebrate Eid ul Fitr after 30 days of fasting and give charity to the poor.
Congregation	A group of people assembled for religious worship.
Saum	Fasting—one of the pillars of Islam.
Revelation	An act of revealing or making known. (Allah revealed the Quran during Ramadan)
Sujud	Sujūd is the act of low bowing or prostration to Allah (God) facing the qiblah (Kaba)
