Why would an adult get baptised?

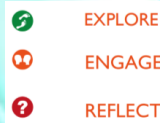


Essential knowledge

- Know Baptism is a sign of repentance - saying sorry and turning away from wrongdoing (sin).

- Know a range of significant individuals including Christian Benteke and Justin Bieber or Mahatma Gandhi and consider how religion influenced their choices.

Protestant	Western Christian church

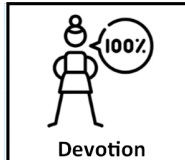


Adult baptism symbolises death, burial and resurrection.
