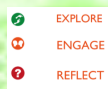
Why are there prophetic tales in the Quran?

- Understand the lesson in the lives of Prophet Younus PBUH and Prophet Adam PBUH.
- The stories of the prophets are in the Quran to inspire Muslims to lead honest life.

Key Vocabulary

Quran	The Islamic sacred book, believed to be the word of God as dictated to Muhammad PBUH
Arabic	A language the Quran is written in.
prophet	A person regarded as an inspired teacher or proclaimer of the will of God.
PBUH	Abbreviation for "peace be upon him" which Muslims say after the Prophets' names.
Adam PBUH	In Islam Adam PBUH is believed to have been the first human being on Earth and the first prophet on earth.
Younus PBUH	Younus PBUH is another prophet in Islam who was swallowed by a whale.
Hawa PBUH	The first woman on earth who was ordered to leave paradise. Another name for Hawa
