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15 Hour Funded Childcare for 2, 3 and 4 Year Olds

Eligible families could get up to 15 hours of funded childcare a week for the equivalent of equivalent of 38 weeks a year (or 570 hours per year). This is known as Think2 in Staffordshire.

Families must meet at least one of the criteria listed below:

- earnings less than £16,190 per year (£15,400 for Universal Credit)
- in receipt of Jobseekers Allowance, or Income Support
- the child is looked after by Staffordshire County Council
- in receipt of Disability Living Allowance (DLA), leaving care or other similar benefits.

There are 3 settings that make up the Early Years Department:

Cubs, Nursery and Reception.



We welcome our youngest children to the Hempstalls family at the age of 2 in our Cubs setting. Parents and carers may choose any combination of morning or afternoon sessions to meet the needs of their child. Children benefit from a warm and welcoming indoor/outdoor environment, weekly swimming, 'Cool Cats' (Physical Development), forest school and Rhythm Time sessions.

Caring Bears Nursery (Age 3-4)

When children are 3 years old, they will be welcomed into our Nursery. Your child may be entitled to 15 or 30 hours of free child care. The nursery setting offers both indoor and outdoor facilities and all children will have the opportunity to take part in weekly swimming session in our school swimming pool, Cool Cats (Physical Development) and forest school sessions.





Reception (Age 4-5)

Our vibrant and nurturing Reception setting welcomes children who are 4 and 5 years old. Children will be offered the opportunity to take part in a weekly swimming session to build water confidence and

begin to push and glide through the water. Children in Reception will also be able to enjoy sessions in our Forest School where they can explore the outdoors, build shelters and even cook marshmallows on the open fire. Our Autumn Term **Reception Sleepover** is always very popular!



Arbor

Arbor is an online platform used for pupil data, collection of payments and much more. All children at Hempstalls will have an Arbor profile which can be accessed easily via the online website *https://login.arbor.sc/* or mobile app.

Through this profile, you will see your child's personal information, add and edit contact details, make bookings and payments for meals, clubs and trips. All information is stored following GDPR guidelines and parental access is gained through security questions. You will soon receive a login for your child's profile.

Medicines & Inhalers in School


Please inform us if your child has any medical needs that we need to be aware of. In partnership with parents, we will complete a Care Plan to ensure that your child is receiving the correct care. This could be discussed at your home visit or transition visit. If your child is prescribed medication to be taken 3 times a day we recommend that this is administered by you before school, after school and at bed time. However, if the dose is prescribed to be taken 4 times a day we will administer one of the doses during school time but it must be a prescribed medicine with the pharmacist's label on the bottle and your child's name on. Parent's must visit the school office with the medicine so that the medicine can be stored securely and to complete a Medication Consent Form.



Swimming


We are fortunate to have the facility of a swimming pool at Hempstalls. You will be informed when your child begins swimming lessons. Girls will require a swim suit, cap and towel, boys need trunks (not shorts) and a towel. All long hair must be tied up with a swimming cap. We can not let your child swim if they have earrings in, for health and safety reasons, please make sure these are removed on swimming and P.E days. If you are thinking about getting your child's ears pierced please do this at the start of the six weeks holiday so that they will not miss any of their swimming lessons.

supervised toothbrushing scheme

Information and Consent Form

Welcome to Brilliant Brushers supervised toothbrushing scheme

Young children in this area have some of the worst rates of tooth decay in the West Midlands. Did you know that in 2019-20 tooth decay was the main reason for hospital admissions in children aged 6-10, with over 22,000 admissions? Tooth decay causes unnecessary pain, sleepless nights and time off school but the good news is that it is largely preventable.

What is Brilliant Brushers?

An exciting supervised toothbrushing scheme that is being offered to all 3-5 year olds in your child's nursery or school to help keep their teeth healthy.

How will it happen?

The staff in the setting will be trained and supported by the oral health improvement team to supervise toothbrushing once a day.

Each child will be given their own numbered toothbrush for toothbrushing in the setting and a toothbrush pack for them to take home for you to help brush their teeth at home.

Resources for the supervised toothbrushing in the setting will be provided free of charge and replacements will be provided.

At home you can do your bit too

Brush your child's teeth at home twice a day, especially last thing at night. They need your help with toothbrushing until they are around 7 years old. Use a family strength fluoride toothpaste, that's one with 1450 parts per million fluoride. You can find this in the list of ingredients.

For children aged 0-2 years, use a smear of family toothpaste on a dry toothbrush. If they are 3 years and over use a pea sized amount. Encourage them to spit out and not rinse out with water.
