## Artist, craft maker or designer: Stephen Wiltshire



Stephen Wiltshire is an English artist who draws detailed cityscapes. He was born in 1974 and grew up in London. As a child Wiltshire was mute and diagnosed with autism. He began to show an interest in drawing; his first drawings were of animals and cars before he moved on to cityscapes. He has the ability to see a landscape just once and then draw it accurately from memory. His London panorama is produced with pen on paper.

### What should I already know?

- I can use shading and tone to show the effect of light and shadow.
- I can demonstrate perspective.
- I can represent objects as being 3D when drawing.

#### What will I learn?

- I will make accurate drawings from observation using a variety of techniques.
- I will demonstrate an awareness of composition, scale and proportion.
